1 2	AMEND House Committee Substitute for Senate Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 824, Page 48, Section 535.210, Line 47, by inserting immediately after said line the following:
3 4	"589.685. 1. There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Neighborhood Watch Fund",
5	which shall consist of money collected under this section. The general assembly may appropriate
6	moneys to the fund for the purpose of providing funds to counties, cities, towns, other political
7	subdivisions or wards of a city not within a county, as provided in this section. At no time shall the
8	annual amount of funding approved for disbursement from the neighborhood watch fund exceed two
9	hundred fifty thousand dollars.
10	2. Moneys in the fund may be distributed to counties, cities, towns, other political
11	subdivisions or wards of a city not within a county for the creation or establishment of neighborhood
12	watch organizations.
13	3. The director of the department of public safety shall create an application and establish
14	procedures for counties, cities, towns, other political subdivisions or wards of a city not within a
15	county to follow to receive funds under this section. To qualify, a county, city, town, other political
16	subdivision or ward of a city not within a county shall complete an application to the department of
17	public safety.
18	4. The department of public safety shall make a determination regarding the application for a dishumant from the analysis of watch find based on the application submitted by a country
19 20	disbursement from the neighborhood watch fund based on the application submitted by a county, city, town, other political subdivision or ward of a city not within a county. In determining
20 21	disbursement of funds from the neighborhood watch fund, priority shall be given to areas with a high
21	crime rate, as defined in this subsection. An area with a high crime rate, for purposes of this section,
23	is defined as a county or a city, town, other political subdivision or ward of a city not within a county
24	that is in the top twenty-five percent of all counties with the highest overall crime rate, according to
25	the most recently available state highway patrol uniform crime reporting program.
26	5. The director of the department of public safety may promulgate rules and regulations to
27	implement the provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in
28	section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective
29	only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable,
30	section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with
31	the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove
32	and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and
33	any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2014, shall be invalid and void.
34	6. The director of the department of public safety shall administer the neighborhood watch
35	fund. The state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170 and
36	<u>30.180 the state treasurer may approve disbursements</u> . The fund shall be a dedicated fund and, upon

appropriation, money in the fund shall be used solely for the administration of this section.
7. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary, any moneys remaining
in the fund at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the general revenue fund.
8. The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other funds are
invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be credited to the fund."; and
Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references
accordingly.
