FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§ 644.058 - Wastewater Discharge Permits:

Officials from the **Department of Natural Resources (DNR)** assume this proposal would only impact the permit modification applications the department receives. The number of permit modifications the department processes each year to increase or decrease the volume of any water contaminants or pollutants authorized by a permit represents a small percentage of the total permit modification applications received.

DNR states it is difficult to determine the effects of this proposal on the department's ability to operate.

DNR states it is unknown whether or not this proposed legislation would require expansion of the staffing of the Department of Natural Resources. The department assumes the fiscal impact from this proposal is unknown, but could exceed \$100,000.

Oversight assumes this proposal would require anytime DNR receives an application for a modification to a wastewater discharge permit, an independent study of environmental and economic need of allowable water contaminants be completed by DNR.

For the purpose of the fiscal note, **Oversight** will assume a cost of more than \$100,000 to General Revenue, for DNR to complete independent studies for modifications of wastewater discharge permits.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal prohibits the Missouri Clean Water Commission from modifying any permit by increasing or decreasing the volume of any water contaminants or pollutants authorized by the permit to be discharged from any point source or changing any existing limits within the 12 months immediately before any new construction or operating permit is issued until an independent and unique study commissioned by the state verifies the environmental and economic need for the increase or decrease for each stream segment affected.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
