### FISCAL ANALYSIS

# **ASSUMPTION**

Officials at the **Department of Social Services - Children's Division (CD)** assume that by increasing these time frames, this legislation gives potential fathers a greater window of opportunity to establish paternity, increasing the likelihood of getting more fathers and paternal relatives involved, increasing placement options, but possibly extending the filing for termination of parental rights.

It is unknown how many more putative fathers would be involved as a result of this legislation and if the numbers of putative fathers did increase, how many of these cases would result in quicker permanency or just more options to explore actually lengthening the process for the filing for termination of parental rights. The CD does not anticipate a fiscal impact.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** and the **Office of State Courts Administrator** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.
