FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Office of Administration's Office of Equal Opportunity (OA)** assume this proposal would require OA to pay actual and necessary expenses incurred by the committee members in the performance of their duties. Due to the complexity of what would be required by this proposal, it is assumed that the committee would need to meet monthly in order to meet the requirements and deadlines. Committee is proposed of 7 committee members (2 legislators and the Commissioner of OA).

Officials at the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Conservation, the Department of Economic Development, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Higher Education, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Revenue, the Department of Social Services, the Department of Public Safety, the Department of Public Safety's Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Control, the Department of Public Safety's Division of Fire Safety, the Department of Public Safety's Capitol Police, the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, the Missouri Department of Transportation, the Missouri Gaming Commission, the Missouri Highway Patrol, the Missouri House of Representatives, the Missouri National Guard, the Missouri Veterans Commission, the Missouri Senate, the Office of State Courts Administrator, the Office of the State Auditor, the Office of the State Public Defender, Office of State Treasurer and the State Emergency Management Agency each assume there is no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Officials at the **Office of Attorney General** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

Officials at the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** assume it is unknown what procurement rules and regulations might be implemented by the committee defined in this proposal and how such implementation may affect DOC fiscally.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Oversight assumes that any changes to agencies resulting from the information in the disparity study would be an indirect result of this proposal; therefore, Oversight will not reflect it in the fiscal note.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill requires the Office of Administration, in consultation with each state department, to establish and implement a plan to increase and maintain the participation of certified socially and economically disadvantaged small business concerns or minority business enterprises in contracts for supplies, services, and construction with the state after it completes a study of the availability of these businesses. The study will be undertaken by a committee of nine members, appointed by the Commissioner of the Office of Administration, and must be completed by December 31, 2016.

The Minority Business Enterprise and Women's Business Enterprise Oversight Review Committee is established to conduct a new study to ensure participation from socially and economically disadvantaged minority or women's business enterprises, to be completed by December 31, 2015. The committee will include one member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker, one member of the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tem, and four members appointed by the Governor. The Office of Administration will staff the committee and aid in the performance of the committee's duties, which are specified in the bill, including the identification of contractors who may need subcontractors and the notification to potential women and minority subcontractors.

The provisions of the bill regarding the review committee will expire six years after the effective date.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
