FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** assume many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the Secretary of State's Office for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, we also recognize that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what our office can sustain with our core budget. Therefore, we reserve the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Officials from the **Department of Transportation** assume there will be no fiscal impact to their organization since the Motor Carrier Services (MCS) division already has rules and regulations in place regarding the issuance of permits under its Oversize and Overweight (OS/OW) Permit rules when in the public interest. The OS/OW rules specifically address public utilities including emergency repairs of such utilities. Section 304.200, RSMo grants MoDOT's Chief Engineer authority to issue special permits for vehicles or equipment exceeding the limitations on width, length, height, etc when there is good cause to do so and when the public safety or public interest so justifies it.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol**, the **Department of Agriculture** and the **Department of Revenue** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** state this legislation is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.
