FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Insurance**, **Financial Institutions and Professional Registration (DIFP)** state it is unknown what professionals may be affected by this legislation in the future. Therefore, the fiscal impact to DIFP is unknown.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, the **Missouri Department of Conservation**, the **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan**, and the **Columbia/Boone County Department of Public Health and Human Services** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

In response to the previous version of this proposal, officials from the **Department of Social Services (DSS) - MO HealthNet Division (MHD)** assumed this proposal will have no fiscal impact. The MHD assumes that participants are currently receiving all vaccinations that they are seeking.

In response to the previous version of this proposal, officials from the **Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT)** state all Centers for Disease Control (CDC) recommended immunizations are already covered at 100%. Therefore, the MoDOT assumes there would be no fiscal impact on the medical plan.

In response to the previous version of this proposal, officials from the **Department of Mental Health** and **Department of Public Safety - Missouri State Highway Patrol** assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their respective agencies.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

This proposal could have a positive fiscal impact on small business pharmacy providers.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal establishes guidelines for the regulation of occupations and professions not regulated by the Division of Professional Registration within the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration prior to January 1, 2015, and those regulated professions that seek to substantially increase their scope of practice. The proposal specifies that an individual may engage in the occupation of his or her choice, free from unreasonable government regulation. The state may not impose a substantial burden on an individual's pursuit of his or her occupation or profession unless there is a compelling interest for the state to protect the general welfare. Where an interest exists, the regulation adopted by the state should be the least restrictive type of regulation consistent with the public interest to be protected.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
