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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Conservation, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Economic Development, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Higher Education, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional **Registration**, the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations**, the **Department of Mental** Health, the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Public Safety's Capitol Police, the Department of Public Safety's Division of Fire Safety, the Department of Public Safety's Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Control, the Department of Revenue, the Department of Social Services, the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, the Missouri Department of Transportation, the Missouri Ethics Commission, the Missouri Gaming Commission, the Missouri Highway Patrol, the Missouri House of Representatives, the Missouri National Guard, the Missouri Senate, the Missouri Veterans Commission, the Office of Administration, the Office of the Governor, the Office of the Lt. Governor, the Office of the State Auditor, the Office of State Courts Administrator, the Office of the State Public Defender, the Office of State Treasurer and the State Emergency Management Agency each assume there is no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Officials at the **Office of Attorney General** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.
