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### FISCAL ANALYSIS

### ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Transportation (DHT)** assume an unknown negative impact. DHT states that it is difficult to predict with any accuracy the actual impact because they do not have previous claims to compare to. Any estimates would be inaccurate due to the variety of supplements and the prices associated with such.

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration** state that insurers would be required to submit amendments to their policies to comply with legislation. Policy amendments must be submitted to the department for review along with a \$50 filing fee. The number of insurance companies writing these policies in Missouri fluctuates each year. One-time additional revenues to the Insurance Dedicated Fund are estimated to be up to \$5,700.

Additional staff and expenses are not being requested with this single proposal, but if multiple proposals pass during the legislative session which require policy form reviews the department will need to request additional staff to handle increase in workload.

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Conservation**, the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, and **the Department of Mental Health** each assume the current proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol** defer to Department of Transportation Employee Benefits section.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services** and **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan** did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.

Oversight assumes this proposal would increase costs to the medical plan of the state. Oversight will reflect an unknown cost to the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan (MCHCP) distributed across state funds in the following percentages:

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

#### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal requires each health carrier or health benefit plan that offers or issues health benefit plans delivered, issued for delivery, continued, or renewed in Missouri on or after January 1, 2015, to provide coverage for food supplements prescribed by a physician acting within the scope of his or her practice.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
