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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

The officials from the **Attorney General's Office** assume any potential cost arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources but may seek additional appropriations if there is a significant increase in Lemon Law cases or if multiple proposal are passed.

Officials from the **Department of Revenue** (**DOR**) assume the following procedures will need to be implemented for the changes in this proposal:

- Procedures will need to be revised by a Management Analyst I requiring 40 hours at a cost of \$840 in FY `15.
- The Dealers Operating Manual will need to be revised by a Management Analyst I requiring 40 hours at a cost of \$840 in FY `15.

In summary, DOR assumes a cost of 1,680 (840 + 840) in FY 2015 to provide for the implementation of the changes in this proposal.

Oversight assumes DOR is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of activity each year. Oversight assumes DOR could absorb the costs related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require additional staffing and duties at substantial costs, DOR could request funding through the appropriation process.
