FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Governor's Office** assume there should be no added cost to their office as a result of this measure.

Officials from the **Missouri Senate**, the **Department of Mental Health**, the **Department of Natural Resources** and the **Department of Agriculture** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services - Division of Youth Services (DOS)** assume the fiscal impact to their agency is \$0 to Unknown. If the DOS is required to perform the yearly audits the DOS is unsure of the cost to the department and therefore will have an unknown cost.

Oversight assumes DOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of activity each year. Oversight assumes DOS could absorb the costs related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require additional staffing and duties at substantial costs, DOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** assume many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the Secretary of State's Office for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, we also recognize that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what our office can sustain with our core budget. Therefore, we reserve the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.
