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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** assume the penalty provision component of this bill resulting in potential fiscal impact for DOC is for any person who is found guilty of or who pleads guilty to any sexual offense under chapter 566, 568 or 573 to be sentenced one classification higher than the underlying offense if incest is an aggravating factor. Currently, the DOC cannot predict the number of new commitments which may result from the creation of the offense(s) outlined in this proposal. An increase in commitments depends on the utilization by prosecutors and the actual sentences imposed by the court.

If additional persons are sentenced to the custody of the DOC due to the provisions of this legislation, the DOC will incur a corresponding increase in direct offender cost either through incarceration (FY13 average of \$18.014 per offender, per day or an annual cost of \$6,575 per inmate) or through supervision provided by the Board of Probation and Parole (FY13 average of \$5.07 per offender, per day or an annual cost of \$1,851 per offender).

In summary, supervision by the DOC through probation or incarceration would result in additional unknown costs to the department. Sixteen (16) persons would have to be incarcerated each fiscal year to exceed \$100,000 annually. Due to the narrow scope of this new crime, it is assumed the impact would be less than \$100,000 per year for the DOC.

Officials in FY 2013 at the **Office of the State Public Defender** provided representation in 374 C/D felony sex cases and 660 A/B felony sex cases. This proposed legislation will not increase the caseload, but rather elevate the punishment of a C/D charge to the punishment of an A/B charge. Under the recent RubinBrown/American Bar Association study of the Missouri Defender System, all felony sex cases require the same attorney hours, therefore there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at the **Office of Prosecution Services**, the **Department of Social Services' Children's Division** and the **Division of Legal Services**, the **Department of Mental Health**, the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** and the **Department of Health and Senior Services** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal. FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill specifies that any person found guilty of a sexual offense must be sentenced to one classification higher than the underlying offense if the person commits the offense with a victim that is related as specified in the bill.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
