FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **City of Columbia** assume a fiscal impact loss of \$90,000 with the end of the red light camera program.

Officials at the **City of Kansas City** assume the estimated revenue loss to Kansas City from the ban on use of automated traffic enforcement systems would be as follows:

Fiscal year ending April 30, 2016: \$1,467,000 revenue loss Fiscal year ending April 30, 2017: \$2,200,000 revenue loss

Officials at the Missouri Department of Transportation, the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Department of Revenue and the Department of Public Safety's Missouri Highway Patrol each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Officials at the St. Louis County Board of Election Commission, St. Louis County, the Jefferson City Police Department and the Springfield Police Department each assume no fiscal impact to their respective organizations from this proposal.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill prohibits the enforcement of automated traffic systems that establish a motor vehicle is not in compliance with traffic signals, speeds, or other traffic laws, ordinances, or rules on any public street, road, or highway in the state beginning August 28, 2014. Imposing any civil or criminal fines, fees, or penalties for the offenses will be prohibited. Any county, city, town, village, municipality, state agency, or other political subdivision that currently has an automated traffic enforcement system installation or maintenance contract with a company or entity on August 28, 2014 will be required to terminate the contract by September 1, 2015.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
