FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§ 643.700 - Air Conservation Commission Emission Standards for Carbon Dioxide:

Officials from the **Department of Natural Resources (DNR)** would not anticipate a direct fiscal impact from this proposal.

DNR assumes this proposal could result in the department being unable to write a rule and State Implementation Plan (SIP) the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) would approve.

DNR assumes under this scenario, the EPA would implement a Federal Implementation Plan (FIP) in the State of Missouri for the 111(d) proposal for coal fired power plants. As well as taking away any enforcement authority DNR would have for the power plants in regards to this rule.

DNR assumes the EPA could reduce federal grant dollars to implement this piece of the Clean Air Act in Missouri. EPA would have the option to withhold some federal funding as EPA staff would take over some of the duties DNR staff would implement under a state plan.

DNR is unable to estimate a dollar amount at this time, but it would be a percentage of federal funds received by DNR. Federal funds account for approximately 21% of DNR's Air Pollution Control Program budget.

DNR does <u>not</u> currently receive federal funds for activities related to carbon pollution and DNR does not anticipate federal funds increasing. DNR expects to maintain the current level of federal funding regardless of any FIP for carbon pollution standards.

Oversight assumes this proposal has the potential of placing Missouri under a federal plan, meaning each affected source of carbon dioxide would be inspected by and answer to, the EPA.

Under a federal EPA plan, **Oversight** assumes DNR would <u>not</u> be involved with inspections of existing carbon dioxide sources. Federal funds could be reduced under an FIP, but DNR has not received specific federal funding for carbon pollution in the past.

Oversight assumes any fiscal impact from this proposal to DNR would be indirect and will not be reflected in the fiscal note.
