FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Missouri Senate** state the proposal will have no fiscal impact or minimal cost which can be absorbed by present appropriations.

Officials from the **Governor's Office** assume there should be no added cost to their office as a result of this measure.

Officials from the **Office of Administration (OA)** assume in order to fulfill the duties outlined in this proposed concurrent resolution, OA would need to hire a consultant to perform the compensation study. It is unknown at this time how much it would cost to hire the consultant. Since the cost of the study would exceed \$25,000, an RFP would need to be prepared and issued. The cost of the study could vary depending on the scope of the RFP and how many benchmark positions or job classifications are identified for inclusion in the study. There are currently about 900 UCP job classifications and about 2,900 active job titles in SAM II that are either non-UCP or unclassified.

When OA's Division of Personnel researched the cost of a compensation study in 2010 (which included examination/review of only one retirement plan and one healthcare option), it was determined that a study that focused on 100 benchmark positions would cost between \$150,000 and \$200,000. It is estimated that a compensation study performed for the State at this time could exceed \$300,000. There could be increased costs if the scope of the study is broadened, and a more thorough, comprehensive compensation study is requested and performed.

Oversight assumes the Office of Administration study could vary greatly: from studying numerous positions in all 50 states to studying fewer positions in only neighboring and comparable states. Therefore, Oversight will assume the comprehensive compensation study will cost more than \$100,000 in FY 2015 to the General Revenue Fund.
