### AN ACT

To repeal section 160.545, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the A+ Schools Program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 160.545, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 160.545, to read as follows: 160.545. 1. There is hereby established within the department of elementary and 2 secondary education the "A+ Schools Program" to be administered by the commissioner of The program shall consist of [grant awards] scholarships made to graduates of 3 education. 4 public and private secondary schools [that demonstrate a commitment to ensure that] who: 5 (1) [All students be graduated from school; 6 (2) All students Complete a selection of high school studies that is challenging and for 7 which there are identified learning expectations; and 8 [(3) All students] (2) Proceed from high school graduation to a college or postsecondary 9 vocational or technical school or high-wage job with work place skill development opportunities. 10 2. Pursuant to the A+ program, the state board of education shall promulgate rules and regulations [for the approval of grants made under the program to schools that: 11 12 (1) Establish measurable district wide performance standards for the goals of the program 13 outlined in subsection 1 of this section; and 14 (2) that specify the knowledge, skills and competencies, in measurable terms, that 15 students must demonstrate to successfully complete any individual course offered by [the] a Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended EXPLANATION to be omitted from the law. 19 [(3) Do not offer a general track of courses that, upon completion, can lead to a high 20 school diploma; and

(4) Require] further specify rigorous coursework with standards of competency in basic
 academic subjects for students pursuing vocational and technical education [as prescribed by rule
 and regulation of the state board of education; and

24 (5) Have a partnership plan developed in cooperation and with the advice of local 25 business persons, labor leaders, parents, and representatives of college and postsecondary 26 vocational and technical school representatives, with the plan then approved by the local board 27 of education. The plan shall specify a mechanism to receive information on an annual basis from 28 those who developed the plan in addition to senior citizens, community leaders, and teachers to 29 update the plan in order to best meet the goals of the program as provided in subsection 1 of this 30 section. Further, the plan shall detail the procedures used in the school to identify students that 31 may drop out of school and the intervention services to be used to meet the needs of such 32 students. The plan shall outline counseling and mentoring services provided to students who will 33 enter the work force upon graduation from high school, address apprenticeship and intern 34 programs, and shall contain procedures for the recruitment of volunteers from the community 35 of the school to serve in schools receiving program grants.

36 3. A school district may participate in the program irrespective of its accreditation 37 classification by the state board of education, provided it meets all other requirements.

38 4. By rule and regulation, the state board of education may determine a local school 39 district variable fund match requirement in order for a school or schools in the district to receive 40 a grant under the program. However, no school in any district shall receive a grant under the 41 program unless the district designates a salaried employee to serve as the program coordinator, 42 with the district assuming a minimum of one-half the cost of the salary and other benefits provided to the coordinator. Further, no school in any district shall receive a grant under the 43 44 program unless the district makes available facilities and services for adult literacy training as 45 specified by rule of the state board of education.

5. For any school that meets the requirements for the approval of the grants authorized by this section and specified in subsection 2 of this section for three successive school years, by August first following the third such school year, the commissioner of education shall present a plan to the superintendent of the school district in which such school is located for the waiver of rules and regulations to promote flexibility in the operations of the school and to enhance and encourage efficiency in the delivery of instructional services in the school. The provisions of

52 other law to the contrary notwithstanding, the plan presented to the superintendent shall provide 53 a summary waiver, with no conditions, for the pupil testing requirements pursuant to section 54 160.257 in the school. Further, the provisions of other law to the contrary notwithstanding, the 55 plan shall detail a means for the waiver of requirements otherwise imposed on the school related 56 to the authority of the state board of education to classify school districts pursuant to subdivision 57 (9) of section 161.092 and such other rules and regulations as determined by the commissioner 58 of education, except such waivers shall be confined to the school and not other schools in the 59 school district unless such other schools meet the requirements of this subsection. However. 60 any waiver provided to any school as outlined in this subsection shall be void on June thirtieth 61 of any school year in which the school fails to meet the requirements for the approval of the 62 grants authorized by this section as specified in subsection 2 of this section.

63 6. For any school year, grants authorized by subsections 1 to 3 of this section shall be 64 funded with the amount appropriated for this program, less those funds necessary to reimburse 65 eligible students pursuant to subsection 7 of this section].

[7.] **3.** The commissioner of education shall, by rule and regulation of the state board of education and with the advice of the coordinating board for higher education, establish a procedure for the [reimbursement] **payment** of the cost of tuition, books and fees to any public community college or vocational or technical school or within the limits established in subsection [9] **11** of this section for any two-year private vocational or technical school for any student:

72 (1) Who has attended a public or private high school in the state for at least three years 73 immediately prior to graduation [that meets the requirements of subsection 2 of this section], 74 except that students who are active duty military dependents, and students who are dependants of retired military who relocate to Missouri within one year of the date of the parent's retirement 75 76 from active duty, who, in the school year immediately preceding graduation, meet all other 77 requirements of this subsection and are attending a school that meets the requirements of 78 [subsection 2 of] this section shall be exempt from the three-year attendance requirement of this 79 subdivision; and

80 (2) Who has made a good faith effort to first secure all available [federal] sources of 81 funding that could be applied to the [reimbursement described in this subsection] **costs covered** 82 **by this scholarship program**; and

(3) Who has earned a [minimal] grade point average of at least two and one-half points
on a four-point scale, or its equivalent on another scale, while in high school [as determined
by rule of the state board of education,]; and

86 (4) Meets other requirements for the [reimbursement] payment authorized by this 87 subsection as determined by rule and regulation of said board.

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 4. Student financial incentives shall be available for a period of four years after
 89 high school graduation.

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5. To be eligible for a student financial incentive, each student shall:

91 (1) Have attended a public or private high school in Missouri for three consecutive
 92 years prior to high school graduation;

93 (2) Have graduated from high school with an overall grade point average of two 94 and five-tenths or higher on a four-point scale, or its equivalent on another scale, or have 95 graduated from a high school with documented mastery of institutionally identified skills 96 that would equate to a two and five-tenths grade point average or higher on a four-point 97 scale:

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(3) Have performed at least fifty hours of unpaid tutoring or mentoring;

99 (4) Have at least a ninety-five percent attendance record overall for grades nine100 through twelve; and

101 (5) Have maintained a record of good citizenship and avoidance of the unlawful use102 of drugs and alcohol.

103 6. To maintain eligibility, each participating student shall, during the four-year 104 period of incentive availability:

(1) Enroll in and attend on a full-time basis a Missouri public community college,
 vocational or technical school, state technical college, or within the limits established in
 subsection 11 of this section, any two-year private vocational or technical school;

108 (2) Maintain a grade point average of two and five-tenths points or higher on a 109 four-point scale, or its equivalent on another scale; and

(3) Maintain a record of good citizenship and avoidance of the unlawful use ofdrugs and alcohol.

7. The financial incentives shall be made available, subject to appropriation, only
after the student has made a documented good faith effort to first secure all available
postsecondary student financial assistance funds that do not require repayment.

8. Subject to appropriation, the financial incentives shall only be made available to pay the unpaid balance of the cost of tuition, general fees, and up to fifty percent of the book cost after all postsecondary student financial assistance funds have been applied to these costs. If changes are made to the above incentives, the department of elementary and secondary education shall provide payments in the following order of priority:

- 120 (1) The full amount of tuition;
- 121 (2) The general fees; and
- 122 (3) Up to fifty percent of the book cost.

9. Missouri public community colleges, vocational or technical schools, state technical colleges, and two-year private vocational or technical schools shall verify, prior to payment, for each student intending to participate in the program at their institution that:

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(1) By the end of the first semester of the student's participation:

(a) Verification of student eligibility has been received from the high school fromwhich the student graduated;

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(b) The eligible student is enrolled as a full-time student;

(c) A good faith effort has been made to secure all available postsecondary student
 financial assistance funds; and

(d) After all available postsecondary student financial assistance funds are applied,
the student shall receive financial incentive funds. The amount of funds shall depend on
the remaining costs of tuition, general fees, and up to fifty percent of the book cost to
attend that institution, subject to appropriation; and

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(2) During the second and subsequent semesters of the student's participation:

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(a) The eligible student continues to be enrolled as a full-time student;

(b) Good faith efforts continue to be made to secure all available postsecondary
 student financial assistance funds;

141 (c) The student has earned and maintains a grade point average of two and 142 five-tenths points or higher on a four-point scale, or its equivalent on another scale; and

(d) After all other available postsecondary student financial assistance funds are
applied, the student shall receive financial incentive funds. The amount of funds shall be
subject to appropriation and shall depend on the remaining costs of tuition, general fees,
and up to fifty percent of the book cost to attend that institution.

147 [8.] **10.** The commissioner of education shall develop a procedure for evaluating the 148 effectiveness of the **scholarship** program described in this section. Such evaluation shall be 149 conducted annually with the results of the evaluation provided to the governor, speaker of the 150 house, and president pro tempore of the senate.

151 [9.] **11.** For a two-year private vocational or technical school to obtain reimbursements 152 under subsection [7] **3** of this section, the following requirements shall be satisfied:

(1) Such two-year private vocational or technical school shall be a member of the North
Central Association and be accredited by the Higher Learning Commission as of July 1, 2008,
and maintain such accreditation;

156 (2) Such two-year private vocational or technical school shall be designated as a 157 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended;

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158 (3) No two-year private vocational or technical school shall receive tuition 159 reimbursements in excess of the tuition rate charged by a public community college for course 160 work offered by the private vocational or technical school within the service area of such college; 161 and

(4) The reimbursements provided to any two-year private vocational or technical school
shall not violate the provisions of Article IX, Section 8, or Article I, Section 7, of the Missouri
Constitution or the first amendment of the United States Constitution.

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
