AN ACT

To amend chapter 21, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to legislation for economic incentives.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 21, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 21.432, to read as follows:

21.432. 1. In any special session or in any regular session in which proposed legislation contains economic development language which would constitute an 2 3 extraordinary change, such legislation shall include components to encourage small 4 business creation or capacity building and, through incentives, the hiring of underrepresented groups, which include but are not limited to, minorities, women, 5 veterans, persons with disabilities, or long-term unemployed persons. In addition, thirty-6 five percent of jobs shall be located in blighted areas located in enterprise zones, under 7 sections 135.200 to 135.256, blighted areas located in federal empowerment zones, or 8 blighted areas located in central business districts or urban core areas of cities which 9 districts or urban core areas at the time of approval of the project by ordinance, provided 10 that the enterprise zones, federal empowerment zones, or blighted areas contained one or 11 12 more buildings at least fifty years old and suffered from generally declining population or property taxes over the twenty-year period immediately preceding the area's designation 13 14 as a project area by ordinance. 15 2. As used in this section, "extraordinary change" means an increase of more than

15 2. As used in this section, "extraordinary change" means an increase of more than 16 fifty percent of state funding or other benefit to any economic development program or 17 incentive.
