## AN ACT

To repeal section 109.210, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to public and business records.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 109.210, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 109.210, to read as follows:

109.210. As used in sections 109.200 to 109.310 the following words and terms have 2 the meanings indicated, unless the context clearly requires otherwise:

- 3 (1) "Agency", any department, office, commission, board or other unit of state 4 government or any political or administrative subdivisions created for any purpose under the 5 authorities of or by the state of Missouri;
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### (2) "Boards", the local records board;

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(3) "Commission", the state records commission;

8 (4) "Data", a representation of information, knowledge, facts, concepts, or 9 instructions that has been prepared or is being prepared in a formalized manner and that 10 has been processed, or is intended to be processed, in a computer or through other 11 electronic means. Data may be stored in any form, including but not limited to a printout, 12 magnetic storage media, disk, a compact disc, punched card, or as memory of a computer;

(5) "Electronic record", a record created, generated, sent, communicated, received,
or stored by electronic means, but not as a means of backing up or duplicating
information. Metadata, either standing alone or associated with a record, is not an
electronic record;

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

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17 "E-message", a message transmitted between two or more (6) **(a)** 18 telecommunications devices, computers, computer networks, regardless of whether the 19 network is a local, regional, or global network, or other electronic devices capable of 20 receiving electronic messages, regardless of whether the message is converted to hard copy 21 format after receipt, viewed upon transmission, or stored for later retrieval. An E-message 22 may contain any combination of text, internet uniform resource locator (URL) links, and 23 attached files. E-messages include text messages sent over a cell phone or personal digital 24 assistant (PDA) and messages posted or exchanged through social media;

25 (b) E-messages that are electronic records include but are not limited to the 26 following:

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a. Policies and directives;

28 b. Correspondence or memoranda that contain final directives, determinations, 29 instruction, or guidance regarding official business;

30 Minutes of governing boards, advisory groups, ad-hoc committees, or c. 31 workgroups developing programs;

32 d. Messages that authorize, establish, or complete a business transaction; or

33 e. Final reports or recommendations of legislative committees or produced by 34 official task forces or study groups;

35 (c) E-messages that are not electronic records include but are not limited to the 36 following:

37 a. Duplicate copies of messages sent to multiple receivers;

- 38 b. Personal messages and announcements not related to official business;
- 39 c. Preliminary drafts of letters, reports, and memoranda;
- 40 d. Forwarded messages that do not add substantive information to the message 41 being forwarded;
- 42 e. Copies of documents distributed for convenience or reference;
- 43 f. Announcements of social events: and

44 g. Unsolicited or commercial messages commonly known as spam or junk mail;

- 45 (7) "Local record", any record not a state record;
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[(5)] (8) "Metadata", secondary data that organize, manage, and facilitate the use 47 and understanding of primary data. Metadata describes how, when, and by whom 48 particular content was collected, how the content is formatted, and the nature of the 49 content:

50 "Record", document, book, paper, photograph, map, sound recording or other (9) 51 material, regardless of physical form or characteristics, including electronic records and E-52 messages, made or received pursuant to law or in connection with the transaction of official

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53 business. Library and museum material made or acquired and preserved solely for reference or

exhibition purposes, extra copies of documents preserved only for convenience of reference,
metadata, and stocks of publications and of processed documents are not included within the

56 definition of records as used in sections 109.200 to 109.310, and are hereinafter designated as 57 "nonrecord" materials;

59 [(7)] (11) "Social media", forms of electronic communication through which users 60 create online communities to share information, ideas, messages, and other content;
