Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

WHEREAS, Missouri agriculture accounts for \$17.5 billion annually and contributes to our nation's robust agricultural tradition; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Missouri's production of corn and soybeans alone is valued at more than \$3.5 billion per year, with nearly 80 percent of corn and 50 percent of soybeans exported 6 annually; and 8 WHEREAS, these yields are threatened due to no less than six weed species having developed glyphosate resistance throughout important agricultural counties in the state; and 10 11 WHEREAS, without access to new modes of action, farmers soon will be forced to 12 revert to outdated, costly, and environmentally unsustainable farming practices to manage weeds 13 such as tillage and weeding by hand; and 14 15 WHEREAS, 2,4-D tolerant crops is a new technology that will inhibit herbicide-resistant 16 weeds from reducing crop yields in Missouri and allow farmers to employ ecological and 17 economical farming practices; and 18 19 WHEREAS, this new seed technology has been under review by the United States 20 Department of Agriculture (USDA) and Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for more than 21 four years; and 22 23 WHEREAS, these delays by federal regulatory agencies put Missouri farmers at a competitive disadvantage in the global marketplace as Canada and Brazil have already approved

2,4-D tolerant crops; and

WHEREAS, American farmers also must have access to these same tools to provide a livelihood to their families and ensure that Missouri remains a top agricultural producing state:
