2	WHEREAS, the children of Missouri are our future and will provide the leadership, creativity, and productivity to strengthen and sustain the quality of life in our state; and

4	WHEREAS, the state of Missouri has the responsibility for ensuring that our children
5	have every possible opportunity for school and future success; and

7	WHEREAS, each student in Missouri deserves to be challenged academically and
8 9	prepared for college, meaningful employment in our global economy, and lifelong success; and
10	WHEREAS, each student in Missouri deserves to be actively engaged in learning and
11	connected to the school and broader community; and
12	connected to the school and olouder continuinty, and
13	WHEREAS, each student in Missouri deserves to be supported by qualified, caring
14	adults and receive access to personalized learning; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, each student in Missouri deserves to learn about and practice a healthy
17	lifestyle; and

19	WHEREAS, each student in Missouri deserves to learn in an environment that is
20	physically and emotionally safe; and
21	
22	WHEREAS, the consequences of not ensuring our young people are challenged.
23	engaged, supported, healthy and safe are clear; and

25	WHEREAS, nearly 20,500 students did not graduate from Missouri's high schools in
26	2009, with lost lifetime earnings for those students totaling more than \$5.3 billion according to
27	the Alliance for Excellent Education; and

29	WHEREAS, Missouri spends over \$53 million each year to provide community college
30	remediation education for recent high school graduates who did not acquire the basic skills
31	necessary to succeed in college or at work; and

32	WHEREAS, the percent of Missouri children living in poverty has increased from
33	approximately 15% in 2005 to nearly 20% in 2009; and
34	
35	WHEREAS, Missouri's obesity rates have increased 13.4% over 10 years; and

37	WHEREAS, research indicates that more than 20 percent of students report there is no
38	adult at their school who cares about them or knows them well; and

10	WHEREAS, 23% of public schools reported that bullying occurred among students or
11	a daily or weekly basis during the 2009-2010 school year, according to the 2011 Indicators of
12	School Crime and Safety Report:

14	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of
15	Representatives of the Ninety-seventh General Assembly, Second Regular Session, the Senate
16	concurring therein, hereby recognizes September 2014 as Missouri Whole Child Month; and
17	
18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the General Assembly recognizes the value of
19	assuring that each student is challenged, engaged, supported, healthy, and safe; encourages
50	parents, educators, and community members to support a whole child approach to education for
51	each student; and

53	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the General Assembly encourages every Missour
54	school to celebrate Whole Child Month by identifying at least one of the whole child tenets to
55	promote and encourage throughout the month.
