	WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) considers volunteers who receive
2	nominal benefits to be common law employees of the agencies that they serve; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA) requires large
5	employers to provide full-time employees with health insurance coverage; and
6	
7	WHEREAS, the IRS is required to enforce the PPACA mandate that employers provide
8	health insurance and as a result many fire and emergency medical services (EMS) agencies could
9	end up facing penalties starting in 2015 if they do not offer health insurance benefits to their
10	volunteers; and
11	
12	WHEREAS, fire and EMS agencies do not have the resources to provide health benefits
13	to their volunteers, and individual volunteers have no expectation of receiving such benefits from
14	the agencies they serve; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, the National Volunteer Fire Council has sent a letter to the IRS requesting
17	clarification in the final implementing regulations for the PPACA that volunteers will not be
18	treated as employees under that act; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, the IRS has not, at this time, indicated how it will proceed; and
21	
22	WHEREAS, the 113 th United States Congress has introduced H.R. 3685 and S. 1798,
23	proposing the Protecting Volunteer Firefighters and Emergency Responders Act, to make clear
24	that fire and EMS agencies will not be required to offer volunteer personnel health insurance,
25	even if they receive other nominal benefits.
