## **House Resolution No. 1525**

## 97TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY

INTRODUCED BY REPRESENTATIVE CURTIS.

2	<b>WHEREAS</b> , the State of Missouri has embarked on historic changes in its educational system; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, in 2013 several issues emerging from these historic changes became items
5	of concern for parents, teachers, school districts, and children in every educational setting; and
6	
7	WHEREAS, educational technology has proved to be a key component of engaging
8	students, teachers, and parents, whether it is in communicating between home and school,
9	making better use of scarce resources, reducing administrative burdens, or providing additional
10 11	or different modes of instruction suited to the student and the student's situation; and
12	WHEREAS, while more than 90% of teachers surveyed in the DESE 2011 census of
13	technology used computers to communicate or manage student records, only 77% produced
14	media, web or multimedia projects to demonstrate learning and only 86% used a computer to
15	deliver and present instruction; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, only 30% of teachers in the 2011 census of technology reported that they
18	had advanced, as opposed to basic or intermediate level computer skills; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, current teacher certification requirements mention microcomputing
21	applications as one of many teaching method competencies in the elementary education and
22	secondary education basic certification requirements; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, the Missouri Chamber of Commerce released a report in February 2014 that
25	outlined that state of digital learning in Missouri and recommended that state resources for
26	blended and online learning be identified so that districts and schools could expand their
27	offerings; and
28	
29	WHEREAS, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education has appointed a
30	Proficiency-Based Task Force that delivered its first report in March 2013 that recognizes the
31	role of technology in advancing towards proficiency-based learning; and

33	WHEREAS, the potential exists for a synergistic system to improve instructional
34	delivery to elementary and secondary students, while improving the educational technology skills
35	of teacher education candidates as well as teacher training program faculty:

36	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we, the members of the Missour
37	House of Representatives, Ninety-seventh General Assembly, hereby establish the House Interim
38 39	Committee on Educational Technology Improvement; and
40	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the House Interim Committee shall be composed
41	of ten members, with six majority party members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House
42	and four minority party members to be appointed by the Minority Leader of the House; and

44	<b>BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED</b> that the House Interim Committee shall:
45	
46	(1) Identify educational technology uses in elementary and secondary education that
47	demonstrate improved student outcomes;
48 49	(2) Determine the advectional environments where instruction could be improved by
49 50	(2) Determine the educational environments where instruction could be improved by:
51	(a) Targeted professional development in educational technology;
52	(a) Targeted professional development in educational technology,
53	(b) Infrastructure investment;

55	(c) Cooperative programs that link existing centers of educational technology excellence
56	in postsecondary and higher education to elementary and secondary schools and to teacher
57	training programs;

59	(3) Make recommendations about eliminating barriers, prioritizing funding, and changes
60 61	to policy, whether it be statute, regulation, or guidance; and
62	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the House Interim Committee is authorized to hold
63	hearings as it deems advisable and may solicit input or information necessary to fulfill its duties
64	and

66	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the staff of House Research and the Oversight
67	Division of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research shall provide such legal, research
68	clerical, technical, and bill drafting services as the House Interim Committee may require in the
69	performance of its duties; and

71	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the House Interim Committee is authorized to
72	function during the interim between the Second Regular Session of the Ninety-seventh Genera
73	Assembly and the First Regular Session of the Ninety-eighth General Assembly; and
74 75	RE IT EUDTHED DESOLVED that the House Interim Committee shell report its
76	<b>BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED</b> that the House Interim Committee shall report its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly by December 31, 2014.
