

HB 1886 -- AUDIO AND VISUAL RECORDINGS OF OFFICE ENTRANCES OF
CERTAIN ELECTED OFFICIALS

SPONSOR: Marshall

This bill requires the Commissioner of the Office of Administration to install, operate, and maintain an audio and visual recording of the main entrance to the official offices in the capitol building of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Speaker of the House of Representatives, and President Pro Tem of the Senate. The recording must be broadcast live on the Internet and must be archived for at least 75 years. The method of archiving the recording must allow for reproduction of specific time frames of video upon request. The commissioner must develop a request form to reproduce video that must be made available on-line and in print form for which the requester may be charged up to \$10 per hour of recording.

A registered lobbyist is prohibited from entering or exiting the office of these elected officials except through the main entrance specified to the commissioner and from discussing any bill, law, contract, or bid for contract with these elected officials unless the discussion takes place in the official's capitol office.

Any willful violation of these provisions by a registered lobbyist will be a class A misdemeanor and any willful violation by one of the elected officials will be cause for removal from office.
