HCS HB 2271 -- EARLY VOTING (Dugger)

COMMITTEE OF ORIGIN: Committee on Elections

This bill requires each local election authority to establish one advance voting center in each county in the state or at least one center for every 100,000 people in population reasonably distributed throughout the county. Any registered voter may vote by advance ballot in person at any election for a federal or statewide office. Advance voting must begin on the third Saturday prior to the election and end on the Tuesday immediately preceding the election, excluding Sundays. Advance voting must be conducted from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. on weekdays and for a four-hour period between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on Saturdays.

The Secretary of State and each local election authority must provide adequate public notice of the advance voting centers and voting times including a posting at each local election authority's respective office and on the website of each authority that maintains a website. All current procedures for casting and counting absentee ballots and the appointment of election judges and polling places must apply to advance voting. All costs associated with the implementation of advance voting must be reimbursed from general revenue.
