- 1 2. As used in sections 191.594 to 191.596, the following terms shall mean:
- 3 (1) "Department", the department of mental health;

- 4 (2) "Medical school", all allopathic and osteopathic schools of medicine in this state;
 - (3) "Online survey organization", the entity or organization providing the annual online surveys for medical students as described in this section;
 - (4) "Screening instrument", the screening instrument to assess the risk of depression which is selected by the medical schools in this state for use in the online survey conducted under this section. The medical schools in this state shall collectively determine which screening instrument is appropriate for use under this section and each online survey shall use the same screening instrument;
 - (5) "Threshhold score for risk of depression", the value under the screening instrument which identifies a person as being at risk for depression.
 - 191.595. 1. Every medical student enrolled in a medical school in this state shall be provided annually with an opportunity to be screened for risk of depression by completing an online survey which uses the screening instrument defined in section 191.594. Each enrolled medical student shall be provided with an opportunity to participate in such screening each year during such student's period of enrollment in medical school.

 Participation by medical students shall be voluntary.
 - 2. The department of mental health, in consultation with the medical schools in this state, shall select and contract with an online survey organization to conduct the annual online surveys described in subsection 1 of this section for all medical schools in this state, with the cost of such contract to be divided on a pro-rata basis between each medical school in this state. Such contract costs to the medical schools may be offset by gifts, donations, and other funding through sources which may include, but are not limited to, charitable organizations, medical school alumni associations, and state medical associations. Such online survey organization shall have

expertise and experience in providing:

- 2 (1) A confidential web portal or other electronic mechanism
- for the collection of survey data from survey participants,
- 4 including but not limited to confidentiality for survey
- 5 participants and individual survey information collected;
 - (2) Surveys or similar collection of data for medical schools, residency programs, or hospitals; and
- - individual participants.
 - 3. Each medical school in this state shall:
 - (1) Provide the online survey organization with:
- 12 (a) All information required to conduct the online surveys
 13 which are delineated in the contract and described in sections
 14 191.594 to 191.596;
 - (b) Information to be included with students who elect to be notified that they are at risk for depression under subdivision (1) of subsection 4 of this section. Such information shall include mental health professionals and resources available to a medical student through the student's medical school and any such resources available in the community where the medical school is located;
 - (c) The manner in which to notify the medical school that a medical student has requested services under subdivision (2) of subsection 4 of this section. The medical school shall ensure that, upon notification, students who request services from a mental health professional or counselor or through the medical school are referred for services;
 - (d) The manner in which medical students who elect to request immediate services under subdivision (3) of subsection 4 of this section shall be so immediately referred;
 - (2) Pay the medical school's designated pro-rata share of the contract costs for the online survey to the department, which may be offset by other funding sources in accordance with subsection 3 of this section;
- 35 (3) Provide all enrolled medical students with the information necessary to participate in the online survey described in this section; and

- (4) In consultation with the department of mental health and the online survey organization, ensure the confidentiality of the information obtained through the online survey in accordance with this section.
- 4. The online survey organization shall include three checkoff boxes in the online survey which allow the medical student to:

- (1) Elect to be notified if the results of the student's online survey indicate that the student received an at-risk score for depression. If a medical student elects to be so notified, the online survey organization shall notify the student that he or she received an at-risk score for depression and include the materials provided by the student's medical school under paragraph (b) of subdivision (1) of subsection 3 of this section with such notification;
- (2) Elect to request services from a mental health professional or counselor available through the student's medical school if the results of the student's online survey indicate that the student received an at-risk score for depression. If a medical student so requests, the online survey organization shall notify the student's medical school in accordance with paragraph (c) of subdivision (1) of subsection 3 of this section that the student received an at-risk score for depression and requested services from a mental health professional or counselor through the medical school;
- (3) Elect to request immediate services if the results of the student's online survey indicate that the student received an at-risk score for depression. If a medical student so requests, the medical student shall be immediately:
- (a) Provided with a twenty-four-hour-a-day, seven-day-a-week suicide hotline telephone number; and
- (b) Referred for appropriate services. The checkoff box shall include the following options:
- a. Immediate referral for appropriate services available through the student's medical school or institutions affiliated with the student's medical school, if available; or
 - b. Immediate referral to resources not affiliated with the

medical school which are available in the community where the medical school is located.

- All requests under this subsection shall be confidential, with disclosures only to persons or entities required to be informed of the medical student's request in accordance with this section and the medical student's elections under this subsection.
- 8 5. (1) Each medical school shall determine when the annual online surveys shall be conducted in accordance with this section; except that:
 - (a) The initial online survey for students entering medical school shall be conducted as close to the time of matriculation as practical;
 - (b) Subsequent online surveys shall be conducted as close to the same time each year as practical, taking into consideration class schedules, events, and other relevant factors for each medical school.

- In determining when to conduct the annual online survey, each medical school shall take into consideration the reasonable time frames necessary to afford the medical school, the department, and the online survey organization sufficient time to comply with each of the requirements in subdivisions (2) to (6) of this subsection.
- (2) Each medical school in this state shall provide necessary information to conduct the survey of the students enrolled in the medical school to the online survey organization, including the number of students enrolled in each class.
- (3) The online survey organization shall electronically distribute surveys to medical students with the following statement:

"This online survey is being provided to you as a medical student in the State of Missouri by your medical school in accordance with state law (Section 191.595, RSMo). The information gained by these online surveys shall be held in strict confidence and your responses shall not be known to the faculty or administration of your medical school. However, you

may elect to be notified and/or have an opportunity to request assistance from a mental health professional through your medical school or community if the results of your online survey indicate that you are at risk for depression.

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The responses to the online surveys shall be aggregated by an independent organization and reported to your medical school in the aggregate by year in school.

After a phase-in period of three years, this data, in aggregate form only and reported as a percentage, shall be made available to applicants to the medical school and the public.

The purpose of this online survey is to use the principles of evidence-based medicine to allow your medical school to use the data to reduce the root causes of depression and create a learning environment and appropriate support focused on the well being of students like you who are in a learning environment that may find stressful.

Your participation is voluntary, however, you are encouraged to participate in our statewide effort to reduce the stress of medical school and promote an optimal learning environment in which students are properly supported.".

- (4) (a) The online survey organization shall transmit anonymous scores of surveys to the department, identifying threshhold scores for risk of depression for each class at each school, the total number of scores obtained for each class at each school, the total number of students enrolled in each class at each school, and the online survey participation rate for each class at each school.
- (b) When the department certifies that the anonymous data described in paragraph (a) of this subdivision has been received from the online survey organization, the department shall instruct the online survey organization to destroy or otherwise delete all data from such survey in a manner that the only data remaining is aggregated anonymous data; except that, any survey data for which a student has made an election under subsection 4 of this section may be retained for a period of time not to exceed ninety days in order to provide the notifications and referrals required under subsection 4 of this section.

(5) The department shall assess the raw anonymous data and shall count any survey that meets the threshhold score for risk of depression. Based on the number of medical students identified as at-risk students, the department shall calculate the prevalence of at-risk students by class for each medical school for the first-, second-, third-, and fourth-year classes of Missouri medical schools as a percentage by taking the total number of at-risk medical students identified in the online survey by class at each medical school divided by the total number of students who participated in the online survey by class at each medical school.

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- (6) The department shall transmit to each Missouri medical school the percentages of at-risk medical students described in subdivision (5) of this subsection. The percentages of at-risk medical students and participation rate of each class of each Missouri medical school shall be made available on every medical school's website in an easily accessible location on the site and in the format provided by the department which allows for easy comparison. Such percentages and participation rates shall also be made available on the department's website.
- 6. (1) The online surveys described in this section shall be offered by the online survey organization beginning in the 2015-16 school year and annually thereafter. Aggregate survey data shall not be required to be made available to the public until after completion of the online survey for the 2017-18 school year.
- (2) The survey data made available after the completion of the 2017-18 school year shall include the survey data obtained for each class at each medical school for the 2015-16, 2016-17, and 2017-18 school years. Subsequent disclosures of data shall include the survey data for the current classes for the current school year and the two immediately preceding school years.
- 7. The department of mental health shall, in consultation with the online survey organization and the Missouri medical schools, establish protocols to ensure the confidentiality of survey data in accordance with this section.
 - 8. The online survey may include any additional screening

instruments selected by the show-me compassionate medical education research project committee under section 191.596. The results of any such additional screenings shall be reported in the same manner as the results for the screening for at risk for depression under this section.

- 9. The department of mental health may promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2015, shall be invalid and void.
- 191.596. 1. The medical schools in this state may conduct an ongoing multicenter study or studies, which, if conducted, shall be known as the "Show-Me Compassionate Medical Education Research Project", in order to facilitate the collection of data and implement practices and protocols to minimize stress and reduce the risk for depression for medical students in this state, including any additional maladies included in the online survey, as identified and reported under section 191.595.
- 2. There is hereby established the "Show-Me Compassionate Medical Education Research Project Committee", which shall consist of representatives from each of the medical schools in this state and the director of the department of mental health, or the director's designee. The committee:
- (1) May have an initial meeting to organize, and meet as necessary thereafter to implement any research project conducted;
- (2) May select the screening instrument to be used in the online survey under section 191.595, with the department of mental health approving the final selection;
- (3) May select additional screening instruments to measure

- two additional maladies, such as burn-out or anxiety, which shall be included in the online survey under section 191.595, with the department of mental health approving the final selections. If additional screening instruments are selected, the committee may
- 5 seek remedies to medical education that reduce the incidence and prevalence of such maladies in addition to depression; and

- (4) Shall set the date for the show-me medical education day designated under section 9.154. The date selected shall be for 2016 and every year thereafter.
- 10 3. The multicenter study may include, but not shall not be limited to, the following:
 - (1) Utilization of the data identified and reported under section 191.595;
 - (2) Development of study protocols designed to identify the root causes that contribute to the risk of the maladies included in the online survey under section 191.595;
 - (3) Examine the culture of medical schools that may contribute to the maladies included in the online survey under section 191.595;
 - (4) Collection of any relevant additional data, including but not limited to consultation and collaboration with mental health professionals and mental health resources in the communities where medical schools are located;
 - (5) Collaboration between the medical schools in this state in order to share information, and to identify and make recommendations under subdivision (6) of this subsection; and
 - (6) Based on the data and findings under subdivisions (1) to (3) of this subsection:
 - (a) Identify the best practices to be implemented at each medical school designed to address the root causes and changes in medical school culture in order to minimize stress and reduce the risk of depression for medical students and any other maladies included in the online survey under section 191.595;
 - (b) Recommend any statutory or regulatory changes regarding licensure of medical professionals and recommend any changes to common practices associated with medical training or medical practice that the committee believes will accomplish the goals

set out in this section.

4. The medical schools in this state shall prepare an annual report which includes any information under subdivision (6) of subsection 3 of this section and any measures taken by medical schools as a result of the findings under this section.

The report shall be made available annually on each medical school's website and to the Missouri general assembly.

191.597. Under section 23.253 of the Missouri sunset act:

- (1) The provisions of the new program authorized under sections 191.594 to 191.597 shall automatically sunset six years after the effective date of sections 191.594 to 191.597 unless reauthorized by an act of the general assembly; and
- (2) If such program is reauthorized, the program authorized under sections 191.594 to 191.597 shall automatically sunset twelve years after the effective date of the reauthorization of sections 191.594 to 191.597; and
- (3) Sections 191.594 to 191.597 shall terminate on September first of the calendar year immediately following the calendar year in which the program authorized under sections 191.594 to 191.597 is sunset.

Section B. Because immediate action is necessary to ensure the well-being of medical students in this state, the enactment of sections 9.154, 191.594, 191.595, 191.596, and 191.597 of this act are deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, welfare, peace, and safety, and is hereby declared to be an emergency act within the meaning of the constitution, and the enactment of sections 9.154, 191.594, 191.595, 191.596, and 191.597 of this act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval."; and
