2. For all t	axable years beginning on or after January 1,
2016, a taxpayer s	hall be allowed a tax credit for eligible costs
incurred in renova	ting the taxpayer's rented dwelling or
residence. The ta	x credit amount shall be equal to twenty
percent of such el	igible costs, but shall not exceed two thousand

five hundred dollars per taxpayer claiming the credit. The amount of the tax credit issued shall not exceed the amount of the taxpayer's state tax liability for the tax year for which the credit is claimed. If the amount of the tax credit allowed exceeds the amount of the taxpayer's state tax liability for the tax year for which the credit is claimed, the difference shall not be refundable but may be carried forward to any of the taxpayer's three subsequent taxable years. No tax credit issued under this section shall be transferred, sold, or assigned. The aggregate amount of tax credits which may be issued under this section in any one fiscal year shall not exceed five million dollars. The tax credits issued under this section shall be issued on a first-come, first-served filing basis. 

3. To claim the tax credit allowed under this section, the taxpayer shall include with the taxpayer's income tax return any documentation and information required by the department to verify that the taxpayer has actually incurred the eligible costs.

- 4. The department of revenue may promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2015, shall be invalid and void.
  - 5. Under section 23.253 of the Missouri sunset act:
- (1) The provisions of the new program authorized under this section shall automatically sunset on December thirty-first six years after the effective date of this section unless reauthorized by an act of the general assembly; and
  - (2) If such program is reauthorized, the program authorized
