1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 132, Page 1, in the Title, Line 3, by deleting the phrase "motor fuel tax exemptions." and inserting in lieu thereof "taxation."; and 2 3 4 Further amend said bill, Section 144.030, Page 13, Line 305, by inserting immediately after said 5 section and line the following: 6 7 "144.064. 1. Except as provided in subsection 2 of this section, no sales tax levied under this 8 chapter on any firearms or ammunition shall be levied at a rate that is higher than the sales tax levied 9 under this chapter or any other excise tax levied on any sporting goods or equipment or any hunting 10 equipment. 11 2. (1) In addition to any other sales tax imposed under this chapter on the retail sale of any 12 handgun or ammunition, as such term is defined in section 571.063, a tax is hereby levied and imposed upon every retail sale of any handgun or ammunition in this state at the rate of one cent per 13 14 transaction. All revenues derived from the tax imposed under this subsection shall be deposited in 15 the peace officer handgun and ammunition sales tax fund created in this subsection, and shall be used 16 solely to provide funds for video and audio equipment under section 590.715. 17 (2) There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Peace Officer Handgun and 18 Ammunition Sales Tax Fund", which shall consist of money collected under this subsection. The 19 state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, the 20 state treasurer may approve disbursements. The fund shall be a dedicated fund and, upon appropriation, money in the fund shall be used solely as provided in this subsection. 21 22 Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary, any moneys remaining in the fund 23 at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the general revenue fund. The state 24 treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other funds are invested. Any 25 interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be credited to the fund. 26 590.715. 1. All uniformed law enforcement officers in this state shall wear a video camera 27 affixed to the law enforcement officer's uniform while on duty. The video camera shall record the 28 interaction between a law enforcement officer and a member of the public. The recording shall 29 include both audio and video. 30 2. All law enforcement agencies shall preserve any recordings made by a video camera 31 under this section for a minimum of thirty days and shall develop any policies and procedures 32 necessary to execute the provisions of this section. 33 3. The provisions of this section shall not apply to detectives or other law enforcement officers while they are working in an undercover capacity, or to any law enforcement officer in any 34 situation where the wearing of such a video camera would endanger the safety of the officer or the 35 public."; and 36 Action Taken Date
