of 1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for Senate Committee Substitute 2 for Senate Bill No. 172, Page 27, Section 170.029, Line 34, by inserting after all of said line the following: 3 4 "170.310. 1. For school year 2016-17 and each school year 5 thereafter, upon graduation from high school pupils in public 6 schools and charter schools shall have received thirty minutes of 7 cardiopulmonary resuscitation instruction and training in the 8 proper performance of the Heimlich maneuver or other first aid 9 for choking given any time during a pupil's four years of high 10 school. 2. Beginning in school year 2016-17, any public school or 11 12 charter school serving grades nine through twelve [may] shall 13 provide enrolled students instruction in cardiopulmonary 14 resuscitation. Students with disabilities may participate to the 15 extent appropriate as determined by the provisions of the 16 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act or Section 504 of the 17 Rehabilitation Act. [Instruction may be embedded in any health 18 education course] Instruction shall be included in the district's 19 existing health or physical education curriculum. Instruction 20 shall be based on a program established by the American Heart 21 Association or the American Red Cross, or through a nationally 22 recognized program based on the most current national 23 evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care guidelines, and 24 psychomotor skills development shall be incorporated into the 25 instruction. For purposes of this section, "psychomotor skills" 26 means the use of hands-on practicing and skills testing to 27 support cognitive learning.

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[2.] <u>3.</u> The teacher of the cardiopulmonary resuscitation

1 course or unit shall not be required to be a certified trainer of 2 cardiopulmonary resuscitation if the instruction is not designed to result in certification of students. Instruction that is 3 4 designed to result in certification being earned shall be 5 required to be taught by an authorized cardiopulmonary 6 instructor. Schools may develop agreements with any local 7 chapter of a voluntary organization of first responders to 8 provide the required hands-on practice and skills testing.

9 [3.] <u>4.</u> The department of elementary and secondary 10 education may promulgate rules to implement this section. Any 11 rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 12 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this 13 section shall become effective only if it complies with and is 14 subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if 15 applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are 16 nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general 17 assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the 18 effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are 19 subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking 20 authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2012, 21 shall be invalid and void."; and
