AMEND House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 497, Page 3, Section 67.2050, Line 72, by inserting immediately after said line the following:
"144.064. 1. Except as provided in subsection 2 of this section, no sales tax levied under this
chapter on any firearms or ammunition shall be levied at a rate that is higher than the sales tax levied
under this chapter or any other excise tax levied on any sporting goods or equipment or any hunting
equipment.
2. (1) In addition to any other sales tax imposed under this chapter on the retail sale of any
handgun or ammunition, as such term is defined in section 571.063, a tax is hereby levied and
imposed upon every retail sale of any handgun or ammunition in this state at the rate of one cent per
transaction. All revenues derived from the tax imposed under this subsection shall be deposited in
the peace officer handgun and ammunition sales tax fund created in this subsection, and shall be used
solely to provide funds for video and audio equipment under section 590.715.
(2) There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Peace Officer Handgun and
Ammunition Sales Tax Fund", which shall consist of money collected under this subsection. The
state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, the
state treasurer may approve disbursements. The fund shall be a dedicated fund and, upon
appropriation, money in the fund shall be used solely as provided in this subsection.
Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary, any moneys remaining in the fund
at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the general revenue fund. The state
treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other funds are invested. Any
interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be credited to the fund."; and
Further amend said substitute, page 10, section 144.810, line 241, by inserting immediately after
said line the following:
"590.715. 1. All uniformed law enforcement officers in this state shall wear a video camera
affixed to the law enforcement officer's uniform while on duty. The video camera shall record the
interaction between a law enforcement officer and a member of the public. The recording shall
include both audio and video.
2. All law enforcement agencies shall preserve any recordings made by a video camera

under this section for a minimum of thirty days and shall develop any policies and procedures necessary to execute the provisions of this section.

3. The provisions of this section shall not apply to detectives or other law enforcement officers while they are working in an undercover capacity, or to any law enforcement officer in any situation where the wearing of such a video camera would endanger the safety of the officer or the public."; and
