8	"170.310. 1. For school year 2016-17 and each school year thereafter, upon graduation from
9	high school pupils in public schools and charter schools shall have received thirty minutes of
10	cardiopulmonary resuscitation instruction and training in the proper performance of the Heimlich
11	maneuver or other first aid for choking given any time during a pupil's four years of high school.
12	2. Beginning in school year 2016-17, any public school or charter school serving grades nine
13	through twelve [may] shall provide enrolled students instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation.
14	Students with disabilities may participate to the extent appropriate as determined by the provisions of
15	the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act or Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act. [Instruction
16	may be embedded in any health education course] Instruction shall be included in the district's
17	existing health or physical education curriculum. Instruction shall be based on a program established
18	by the American Heart Association or the American Red Cross, or through a nationally recognized
19	program based on the most current national evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care
20	guidelines, and psychomotor skills development shall be incorporated into the instruction. For
21	purposes of this section, "psychomotor skills" means the use of hands-on practicing and skills testing
22	to support cognitive learning.
23	[2.] 3. The teacher of the cardiopulmonary resuscitation course or unit shall not be required
24	to be a certified trainer of cardiopulmonary resuscitation if the instruction is not designed to result in
25	certification of students. Instruction that is designed to result in certification being earned shall be
26	required to be taught by an authorized cardiopulmonary instructor. Schools may develop agreements
27	with any local chapter of a voluntary organization of first responders to provide the required
28	hands-on practice and skills testing.
29	[3.] 4. The department of elementary and secondary education may promulgate rules to
30	implement this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that
31	is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with
32	and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section
33	and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant
34	to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are
35 36	subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2012, shall be invalid and void."; and
