1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for Senate Substitute for Senate Bill No. 457, Page 2, Section 195.070,
2 Line 27, by inserting immediately after said line the following:

3 "195.206. 1. As used in this section, the following terms shall mean:

4 (1) "Opioid antagonist", any intranasal or auto-injector administered naloxone that binds to opioid
5 receptors and blocks or disinhibits the effects of opioids acting on those receptors;

6 (2) "Opioid-related drug overdose", a condition including, but not limited to, extreme physical
7 illness, decreased level of consciousness, respiratory depression, coma, or death resulting from the
8 consumption or use of an opioid or other substance with which an opioid was combined or a condition that a
9 layperson would reasonably believe to be an opioid-related drug overdose that requires medical assistance.

10 2. Notwithstanding any other law or regulation to the contrary, any licensed pharmacist or pharmacy
11 technician in Missouri may sell and dispense an opioid antagonist under physician protocol to any person who
12 is at least eighteen years of age with a valid Missouri identification card or driver license. The licensed
13 pharmacist or pharmacy technician shall record the date of sale, the identification number of the dispensed
14 drug, and the name, address, and date of birth of the person receiving the opioid antagonist.

15 3. A licensed pharmacist or pharmacy technician who, acting in good faith and with reasonable care,
16 sells or dispenses an opioid antagonist and appropriate device to administer the drug and the protocol
17 physician shall not be subject to any criminal or civil liability or any professional disciplinary action for
18 prescribing or dispensing the opioid antagonist or any outcome resulting from the administration of the opioid
19 antagonist.

20 4. Notwithstanding any other law or regulation to the contrary, it shall be permissible for any person
21 to possess an opioid antagonist.

22 5. Any person who administers an opioid antagonist to another person shall, immediately after
23 administering the drug, contact emergency personnel. Any person who, acting in good faith and with
24 reasonable care, administers an opioid antagonist to another person whom the person believes to be suffering
25 an opioid-related drug overdose shall be immune from criminal prosecution, disciplinary actions from his or
26 her professional licensing board, and civil liability due to the administration of the opioid antagonist."; and

28 Further amend said bill, Page 14, Section 338.200, Line 35, by inserting immediately after said line the
29 following:

30 "338.205. 1. Notwithstanding any other law or regulation to the contrary, any person or organization
31 acting under a standing order issued by a health care professional who is otherwise authorized to prescribe an
32 opioid antagonist may store an opioid antagonist without being subject to the licensing and permitting
33 requirements of this chapter and may dispense an opioid antagonist if the person does not collect a fee or
34 compensation for dispensing the opioid antagonist.

35 2. As used in this section, the term "opioid antagonist" shall mean any intranasal or auto-injector
36 administered naloxone that binds to opioid receptors and blocks or disinhibits the effects of opioids acting on
37 those receptors."; and
