# **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

## **ASSUMPTION**

Officials at the **Missouri Ethics Commission** (**MEC**) state if MEC identifies significant violations during the process established in §105.955.14 (2), (3), RSMo or complaints received increase significantly an Investigator would be required to review potential violations. MEC would anticipate that changes or additions to the proposed language set forth in this bill, may require additional associated costs for FTE, equipment, and expenses.

**Oversight** assumes that should MEC have a significant increase in complaints, they can seek additional resources through the appropriation process.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

**Oversight** assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Department of Transportation, Department of Higher Education, the Department of Corrections, the Office of Administration's Division of Personnel, the Missouri House of Representatives, the Office of the State Treasurer, and the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education each assume no fiscal impact from this proposal to their respective organizations.

The Missouri Veteran's Commission did not response to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.
