FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** state many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the Governor.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Officials at the **Office of the Attorney General** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials at the Office of Prosecution Services, the Department of Revenue, the Department of Agriculture, the Office of the State Public Defender, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Conservation, the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Public Safety's Missouri Highway Patrol, the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules and the Department of Economic Development's Division of Energy each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Officials at the City of Columbia, the City of Jefferson, the City of Kansas City, the Cole County Sheriff's Department, the St. Louis County Board of Election Commission, St. Louis County, the Platte County Board of Election Commission and the Springfield Police Department each assume no fiscal impact to their respective entities from this proposal.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill includes trapping, paddle sports, aviation activities, and swimming to the activities included under the definition of "recreational use" as it applies to the provisions regarding landowners' liability for recreational use of land and specifies liability is not limited for a landowner who intentionally injures a participant, knowingly provides unsafe equipment or devices, or fails to use a degree of care that an ordinary person would use.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
