Subject: Labor and Management; Employees - Employers

Bill Summary: This proposal prohibits any public employees from being required to pay dues or other fees to a labor organization.

State Fiscal Highlights

- No direct fiscal impact on the state is anticipated.

Local Fiscal Highlights

- No direct fiscal impact on local political subdivisions is anticipated.

Fiscal Analysis

Officials from the **Department of Social Services**, the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Veterans Commission**, the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations**, **Office of Administration** and the **Missouri Department of Conservation** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.


Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** defer to the Office of Administration to estimate the fiscal impact of the proposed legislation on their organization.

In response to a previous version, officials the **Department of Public Safety - Office of the Adjutant General** and the **Missouri Highway Patrol**, the **Department of Transportation**, the and the **City of Kansas City** each assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Department of Mental Health**, the **Department of Corrections**, and the **Department of Public Safety - State Emergency Management Agency** each deferred to the Office of Administration to estimate the fiscal impact of the proposed legislation on their respective organizations.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal. Also, this legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
