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#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** state the penalty provision component of this bill resulting in potential fiscal impact for DOC, is for up to a Class A misdemeanor. Based upon historical data, we assume that approximately 11 offenders would be sentenced to probation under this new legislation. We assume that all of the offenders would be incarcerated. The average probation time served for these types of sex offenses is 24 months. The FY14 average cost of supervision is \$6.72 per offender per day or an annual cost of \$2,453 per offender. The DOC would assume costs in the range of \$0 to \$22,486 in FY 2016, \$0 to \$55,045 in FY 2017 and \$0 to \$84,219 in FY 2017.

**Oversight** will reflect a cost of under \$100,000 for each year for the Department of Corrections.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services (OPS)** assume the proposal would not have a measurable fiscal impact on their agency. The creation of a new crime creates additional responsibilities for county prosecutors which may, in turn, result in additional costs which are difficult to determine.

In response to a similar proposal from this year (HB 208), officials at the **Office of State Public Defender (SPD)** stated for the purpose of this proposed legislation, the SPD cannot assume that existing staff will provide effective representation for any new cases arising where indigent persons are charged with the proposed new crime of sexual exploitation by a person of higher authority which would be a new class B misdemeanor.

While the number of new cases (or cases with increased penalties) may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific bill, the SPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide effective representation in all cases where the right to counsel attaches.

**Oversight** assumes the SPD can absorb the additional caseload that may result from this proposal.

Officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** and the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies. L.R. No. 0935-01 Bill No. HB 211 Page 4 of 5 January 20, 2015

#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

#### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal establishes Carrie's Law that creates the crime of sexual exploitation by a person of higher authority, a class B misdemeanor with specified exceptions when it is a class A misdemeanor. A person commits the crime if he or she holds himself or herself out to be in any higher authority than the victim whether the authority is related to a professional license or is recognized or upheld as an authority figure within the scope of his or her relationship with a specific group or body of individuals or constituencies and engages in sexual conduct with another person who is not his or her spouse and the sexual conduct occurred following a documented pattern of efforts to seduce the victim over a period of time and during the course of a meeting in which the victim sought or received instruction, counseling, advice, therapy, aid, or comfort from the person or within 120 days after the meeting has ended; or during a period of time in which the victim was meeting on an ongoing basis with the person of higher authority to seek or receive instruction, counseling, advice, therapy, aid, or comfort; or while the person was in a position of trust or authority over the victim and used that position of trust or authority to engage in the sexual conduct.

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## FISCAL DESCRIPTION (continued)

Consent by the victim is not a defense under these provisions.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
