FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

§163.045 Foundation Formula Calculation

Officials at the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** assume the additional funds the Valley R-6 School District would receive as a result of this bill are as follows:

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The calculations were based on FY 2015 payment data. As long as the formula is underfunded there would be no additional cost to the state. In this case the additional money is going to be

shifted from all other school districts. If the formula is fully funded then it would be an additional cost to the state of \$2,225,903 for the fiscal note period.

Officials at the **Valley R-VI School District** assume a positive impact to the school but defer to Department of Elementary and Secondary Education for the exact impact.

Oversight notes that DESE and the Office of Administration's Division of Budget and Planning were not able to provide Oversight with a projection of when the foundation formula may be fully funded. This proposal would not have a net fiscal impact to the state until such time as the formula is fully funded. Therefore, Oversight will not show this proposal fiscally impacting the state.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

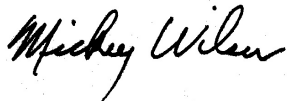
FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Currently, hold harmless school districts with an average daily attendance of 350 or less receive state aid under a different calculation than hold harmless school districts with an average daily attendance of greater than 350. This bill provides that for any seven-director school district, most or all of which is located in Washington County, whose average daily attendance from 350 or less increases to greater than 350, the school district's state aid will be calculated using the calculation for hold harmless districts with an average daily attendance of 350 or less. In addition, any qualifying district will also receive the same amount of funds it received in the previous year from the annual \$15 million appropriation under §163.044.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
