FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Callaway County, Everton R-III School District, Jackson County Board of Election Commission, Kansas City Public Schools, Kansas City Board of Election Commission, Mississippi County, Office of the Secretary of State, Platte County Board of Election Commission and the Special School District of St. Louis each assume there is no fiscal impact to their respective organizations from this proposal.

Officials at the **St. Louis County Board of Election Commission** assume that if a school district chooses undesirable locations in a building they may force the county to look at other buildings. The potential rental fee of \$150 times the 200 polling places currently in schools could cost the county \$30,000.

Officials at the **Lincoln County** assume that if the school district moves them to a less accessible part of the school building then they would need to rent another location. This would increase election costs as the school buildings are free. The impact is unknown at this time.

Officials at the **Kirbyville R-VI School District** assume they spend extra on election day for increased security personnel. Moving the polling place in the building would save that expense.

Oversight notes this proposal would allow local election authorities and school boards to work together to determine the most desirable and accessible location in a school building to put polling places. Oversight will not show a fiscal impact for this proposal.
