1 AMEND Senate Bill No. 627, Page 1, In the Title, Lines 2-3, by deleting the phrase "suicide
2 awareness and prevention" and inserting in lieu thereof the phrase "higher education"; and
3

4 Further amend said bill and page, Section A, Line 2, by inserting after all of said section and line
5 the following:

7 "173.1101. The financial assistance program established under sections 173.1101 to
8 173.1107 shall be hereafter known as the "Access Missouri Financial Assistance Program". The
9 coordinating board and all approved private, [and] public, and virtual institutions in this state shall
10 refer to the financial assistance program established under sections 173.1101 to 173.1107 as the
11 access Missouri student financial assistance program in their scholarship literature, provided that no
12 institution shall be required to revise or amend any such literature to comply with this section prior
13 to the date such literature would otherwise be revised, amended, reprinted or replaced in the
14 ordinary course of such institution's business.

15 173.1102. 1. As used in sections 173.1101 to 173.1107, unless the context requires
16 otherwise, the following terms mean:

17 (1) "Academic year", the period from July first of any year through June thirtieth of the
18 following year;

19 (2) "Approved private institution", a nonprofit institution, dedicated to educational
20 purposes, located in Missouri which:

21 (a) Is operated privately under the control of an independent board and not directly
22 controlled or administered by any public agency or political subdivision;

23 (b) Provides a postsecondary course of instruction at least six months in length leading to or
24 directly creditable toward a certificate or degree;

25 (c) Meets the standards for accreditation as determined by either the Higher Learning
26 Commission or by other accrediting bodies recognized by the United States Department of
27 Education or by utilizing accreditation standards applicable to nondegree-granting institutions as
28 established by the coordinating board for higher education;

29 (d) Does not discriminate in the hiring of administrators, faculty and staff or in the
30 admission of students on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin and is in
31 compliance with the Federal Civil Rights Acts of 1964 and 1968 and executive orders issued
32 pursuant thereto. Sex discrimination as used herein shall not apply to admission practices of
33 institutions offering the enrollment limited to one sex;

34 (e) Permits faculty members to select textbooks without influence or pressure by any
35 religious or sectarian source;

36 (3) "Approved public institution", an educational institution located in Missouri which:

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- 1 (a) Is directly controlled or administered by a public agency or political subdivision;
 2 (b) Receives appropriations directly or indirectly from the general assembly for operating
 3 expenses;
 4 (c) Provides a postsecondary course of instruction at least six months in length leading to or
 5 directly creditable toward a degree or certificate;
 6 (d) Meets the standards for accreditation as determined by either the Higher Learning
 7 Commission, or if a public community college created under the provisions of sections 178.370 to
 8 178.400 meets the standards established by the coordinating board for higher education for such
 9 public community colleges, or by other accrediting bodies recognized by the United States
 10 Department of Education or by utilizing accreditation standards applicable to the institution as
 11 established by the coordinating board for higher education;
 12 (e) Does not discriminate in the hiring of administrators, faculty and staff or in the
 13 admission of students on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin and is otherwise in
 14 compliance with the Federal Civil Rights Acts of 1964 and 1968 and executive orders issued
 15 pursuant thereto;
 16 (f) Permits faculty members to select textbooks without influence or pressure by any
 17 religious or sectarian source;
 18 (4) "Approved virtual institution", an educational institution that meets all of the following
 19 requirements:
 20 (a) Is recognized as a qualifying institution by gubernatorial executive order issued prior to
 21 August 28, 2016, and through a memorandum of understanding between the state of Missouri and
 22 the approved virtual institution;
 23 (b) Is organized as a nonprofit institution;
 24 (c) Is accredited by a regional accrediting agency recognized by the United States
 25 Department of Education;
 26 (d) Has established and continuously maintains a physical campus or location of operation
 27 within the state of Missouri;
 28 (e) Maintains at least twenty-five full-time Missouri employees, at least one-half of which
 29 shall be faculty or administrators engaged in Missouri operations;
 30 (f) Enrolls at least one thousand Missouri residents as degree or certificate seeking students;
 31 and
 32 (g) Maintains a governing body or advisory board based in Missouri with oversight of
 33 Missouri operations.
 34 (5) "Coordinating board", the coordinating board for higher education;
 35 [(5)] (6) "Expected family contribution", the amount of money a student and family should
 36 pay toward the cost of postsecondary education as calculated by the United States Department of
 37 Education and reported on the student aid report or the institutional student information record;
 38 [(6)] (7) "Financial assistance", an amount of money paid by the state of Missouri to a
 39 qualified applicant under sections 173.1101 to 173.1107;
 40 [(7)] (8) "Full-time student", an individual who is enrolled in and is carrying a sufficient
 41 number of credit hours or their equivalent at an approved private, [or] public, or virtual institution
 42 to secure the degree or certificate toward which he or she is working in no more than the number of
 43 semesters or their equivalent normally required by that institution in the program in which the
 44 individual is enrolled. This definition shall be construed as the successor to subdivision (7) of
 45 section 173.205 for purposes of eligibility requirements of other financial assistance programs that
 46 refer to section 173.205.
 47 2. The failure of an approved virtual institution to continuously maintain all of the
 48 requirements in subdivision (4) of subsection 1 of this section shall preclude such institution's

1 students or applicants from being eligible for assistance under sections 173.1104 and 173.1105.

2 173.1104. 1. An applicant shall be eligible for initial or renewed financial assistance only
3 if, at the time of application and throughout the period during which the applicant is receiving such
4 assistance, the applicant:

5 (1) Is a citizen or a permanent resident of the United States;

6 (2) Is a resident of the state of Missouri, as determined by reference to standards
7 promulgated by the coordinating board;

8 (3) Is enrolled, or has been accepted for enrollment, as a full-time undergraduate student in
9 an approved private, [or] public, or virtual institution; and

10 (4) Is not enrolled or does not intend to use the award to enroll in a course of study leading
11 to a degree in theology or divinity.

12 2. If an applicant is found guilty of or pleads guilty to any criminal offense during the
13 period of time in which the applicant is receiving financial assistance, such applicant shall not be
14 eligible for renewal of such assistance, provided such offense would disqualify the applicant from
15 receiving federal student aid under Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended.

16 3. Financial assistance shall be allotted for one academic year, but a recipient shall be
17 eligible for renewed assistance until he or she has obtained a baccalaureate degree, provided such
18 financial assistance shall not exceed a total of ten semesters or fifteen quarters or their equivalent.
19 Standards of eligibility for renewed assistance shall be the same as for an initial award of financial
20 assistance, except that for renewal, an applicant shall demonstrate a grade-point average of two and
21 five-tenths on a four-point scale, or the equivalent on another scale. This subsection shall be
22 construed as the successor to section 173.215 for purposes of eligibility requirements of other
23 financial assistance programs that refer to section 173.215.

24 173.1105. 1. An applicant who is an undergraduate postsecondary student at an approved
25 private, [or] public, or virtual institution and who meets the other eligibility criteria shall be eligible
26 for financial assistance, with a minimum and maximum award amount as follows:

27 (1) For academic years 2010-11, 2011-12, 2012-13, and 2013-14:

28 (a) One thousand dollars maximum and three hundred dollars minimum for students
29 attending institutions classified as part of the public two-year sector;

30 (b) Two thousand one hundred fifty dollars maximum and one thousand dollars minimum
31 for students attending institutions classified as part of the public four-year sector, including State
32 Technical College of Missouri; and

33 (c) Four thousand six hundred dollars maximum and two thousand dollars minimum for
34 students attending approved private institutions;

35 (2) For the 2014-15 academic year and subsequent years:

36 (a) One thousand three hundred dollars maximum and three hundred dollars minimum for
37 students attending institutions classified as part of the public two-year sector; and

38 (b) Two thousand eight hundred fifty dollars maximum and one thousand five hundred
39 dollars minimum for students attending institutions classified as part of the public four-year sector,
40 including State Technical College of Missouri, [or]; approved private institutions; or approved
41 virtual institutions.

42 2. All students with an expected family contribution of twelve thousand dollars or less shall
43 receive at least the minimum award amount for his or her institution. Maximum award amounts for
44 an eligible student with an expected family contribution above seven thousand dollars shall be
45 reduced by ten percent of the maximum expected family contribution for his or her increment
46 group. Any award amount shall be reduced by the amount of a student's payment from the A+
47 schools program or any successor program to it. For purposes of this subsection, the term
48 "increment group" shall mean a group organized by expected family contribution in five hundred

1 dollar increments into which all eligible students shall be placed.

2 3. If appropriated funds are insufficient to fund the program as described, the maximum
3 award shall be reduced across all sectors by the percentage of the shortfall. If appropriated funds
4 exceed the amount necessary to fund the program, the additional funds shall be used to increase the
5 number of recipients by raising the cutoff for the expected family contribution rather than by
6 increasing the size of the award.

7 4. Every three years, beginning with academic year 2009-10, the award amount may be
8 adjusted to increase no more than the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U),
9 1982-1984 = 100, not seasonally adjusted, as defined and officially recorded by the United States
10 Department of Labor, or its successor agency, for the previous academic year. The coordinating
11 board shall prepare a report prior to the legislative session for use of the general assembly and the
12 governor in determining budget requests which shall include the amount of funds necessary to
13 maintain full funding of the program based on the baseline established for the program upon the
14 effective date of sections 173.1101 to 173.1107. Any increase in the award amount shall not
15 become effective unless an increase in the amount of money appropriated to the program necessary
16 to cover the increase in award amount is passed by the general assembly.

17 173.1107. A recipient of financial assistance may transfer from one approved public [or],
18 private, or virtual institution to another without losing eligibility for assistance under sections
19 173.1101 to 173.1107, but the coordinating board shall make any necessary adjustments in the
20 amount of the award. If a recipient of financial assistance at any time is entitled to a refund of any
21 tuition, fees, or other charges under the rules and regulations of the institution in which he or she is
22 enrolled, the institution shall pay the portion of the refund which may be attributed to the state grant
23 to the coordinating board. The coordinating board will use these refunds to make additional awards
24 under the provisions of sections 173.1101 to 173.1107."; and
