5	from high school, pupils in public schools and charter schools shall have received thirty minutes of
6	cardiopulmonary resuscitation instruction and training in the proper performance of the Heimlich
7	maneuver or other first aid for choking given any time during a pupil's four years of high school.
8 9	2. Beginning in school year 2017-18, any public school or charter school serving grades nine through twelve [may] shall provide enrolled students instruction in cardiopulmonary
10	resuscitation. Students with disabilities may participate to the extent appropriate as determined by
11	the provisions of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act or Section 504 of the
12	Rehabilitation Act. [Instruction may be embedded in any health education course] Instruction shall
13	be included in the district's existing health or physical education curriculum. Instruction shall be
14	based on a program established by the American Heart Association or the American Red Cross, or
15	through a nationally recognized program based on the most current national evidence-based
16	emergency cardiovascular care guidelines, and psychomotor skills development shall be
17	incorporated into the instruction. For purposes of this section, "psychomotor skills" means the use
18	of hands-on practicing and skills testing to support cognitive learning.
19	[2.] <u>3.</u> The teacher of the cardiopulmonary resuscitation course or unit shall not be required
20	to be a certified trainer of cardiopulmonary resuscitation if the instruction is not designed to result in
21	certification of students. Instruction that is designed to result in certification being earned shall be
22	required to be taught by an authorized cardiopulmonary instructor. Schools may develop
23	agreements with any local chapter of a voluntary organization of first responders to provide the
24	required hands-on practice and skills testing.
25	[3.] <u>4.</u> The department of elementary and secondary education may promulgate rules to
26	implement this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that
27	is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies
28	with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This
29	section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly
