FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Public Safety's Missouri Highway Patrol (DPS/MHP)** assume there are 214 ambulance districts (service areas) in the state of Missouri. Currently, the Department of Health and Senior Services licenses emergency medical personnel employed with an ambulance district. The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division processes approximately 2,700 name-based criminal record checks for the Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) annually. Therefore, it is assumed that the number of criminal record checks (state and federal background check) processed for employment with an ambulance district would be similar to those processed for DHSS.

The charge for each background check processed is \$43.05. Twenty dollars for the state fingerprint check, \$14.75 for the federal check, and an \$8.30 charge for the electronic fingerprint option used through a third-party vendor (\$20 + \$14.75 + \$8.30 = \$43.05). Of this amount, the state retains the \$20 fee and \$2 of the federal charge of the \$14.75 for a pass thru fee. The \$8.30 charge is paid directly to the vendor at the time of application.

Officials at the **Cole County Sheriff's Department** assume a cost of less than \$10,000 annually from this proposal.

Officials at St. Louis County, the Boone County Sheriff's Department, the Jefferson City Police Department, the St. Louis County Police Department and the Springfield Police Department each assume no fiscal impact to their respective entities from this proposal.

In response to a previous version, officials at the Callaway County Commission, the City of O'Fallon and the City of Kansas City each assumed no fiscal impact to their respective entities from this proposal.

Oversight assumes that because Ambulance Districts are local political subdivisions, they would be paying for the cost of the license each year. Assuming DPS/MHP is running background checks on 2,700 individuals each year at \$43.05 each, this would result in \$116,235 in expenses to the Ambulance Districts. Oversight will therefore show the cost of a direct fiscal impact to Ambulance District Funds of \$0 to \$116,235 each year.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill authorizes ambulance districts by policy, rule, or regulation to require the fingerprinting of employment applicants or licensees in specified occupations for the purpose of receiving criminal history record information. Currently, only municipalities and counties by local or county ordinance have this authority.

HCA #1: This amendment repeals an outdated provision regarding the Missouri Uniform Law Enforcement System (MULES).

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
