FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Office of the State Courts Administrator, Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol, Office of Administration - Division of General Services each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal could be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the Office of Administration - Division of Facilities Management, Design and Construction (FMDC) state currently, they have a promulgated regulation that prohibits, with certain significant exceptions, the carrying of firearms or other weapons onto state property including parking lots and structures (1 CSR 35-1.050). FMDC would have to create and promulgate a new or amended regulation to be consistent with the terms of this bill. FMDC assumes that the revision of regulations that would be required by this bill could be accomplished with existing resources.
