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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Everton R-III School District** assume the proposal would cost them \$50,000 per year.

Officials from the **Shell Knob School District** assume this proposal would have a huge negative fiscal impact on the school district.

Officials from the **Concordia R-II School District** assume parents could question class lessons or homework based on the current wording of the proposal. This questioning would lead to calls to the school district's attorney. At the present time, the attorney's fee is \$185 per hour. Assuming two hours of legal time a week until clarification of the law/guidelines are established, it is assumed the school district would incur estimated costs of \$6,660 per year excluding any lawsuits that might be filed (\$185/hour X 36 week school year X 2 hours per week = \$6,660).

Officials from the **City of St. Charles School District** state the proposal will have an unknown fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Malta Bend School District** assume the proposal may have a small impact on their school district.

Oversight assumes some school districts may incur legal fees as a result of this proposal and will present unknown costs exceeding \$100,000 annually for school districts.

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General (AGO)** assume any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources. The AGO may seek additional appropriations if the proposal results in a significant increase in cases.

Officials from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Social Services, divisions of: Legal Services, Youth Services and Children's, the Office of State Courts Administrator, the Chilhowee R-IV School District, East Newton R-VI Schools, the Eldon School District, the Fox C-6 School District, the Kansas City Public Schools, the Kearney R1 School District, the Kingston 42 School District, the Macon County R-IV Schools, the New Haven School District, Parkway Schools, the Riverview Gardens School District, the Sarcoxie R-II School District and the Warren County R-III School District each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill specifies that the liberty of a parent to direct the upbringing, education, and care of his or her child is a fundamental right. The State of Missouri and any political subdivision of the state is prohibited from infringing on this right without demonstrating a compelling governmental interest.

Any law or policy must be narrowly tailored and by the least restrictive means to achieve the interest. These provisions apply to all laws of the state, whether adopted before or after the enactment of these provisions. Any law adopted after the enactment of these provisions is exempt only if the law explicitly excludes the application by reference to these provisions.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
