Certain small businesses that sell liquor by the drink may be impacted by this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill allows specified tax-exempt charitable, fraternal, religious, service, or veterans' organizations that are licensed to sell intoxicating liquor by the drink at retail for consumption on the premises in St. Louis City to apply to the Supervisor of Alcohol and Tobacco within the Department of Public Safety for a special permit to remain open until 3:00 a.m. each day of the week and to open at 9:00 a.m. on Sundays.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
