#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol**, the **Office of the State Courts Administrator**, and the **Department of Agriculture** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services (OPS)** assume the proposal would not have a measurable fiscal impact on their agency. The creation of a new crime creates additional responsibilities for county prosecutors which may, in turn, result in additional costs which are difficult to determine.

For the purpose of this proposed legislation, officials at the **Office of State Public Defender** (**SPD**) cannot assume that existing staff will provide effective representation for any new cases arising where indigent persons are charged with the proposed new crime of tampering with farm equipment - a new class A misdemeanor.

While the number of new cases (or cases with increased penalties) may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific bill, the SPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide effective representation in all cases where the right to counsel attaches.

**Oversight** assumes the SPD can absorb the additional caseload that may result from this proposal.

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** state this bill adds section 569.098 which establishes the offense of tampering with farm equipment. Penalty provision includes a class D felony (class E, Jan. 01, 2017) if resulting damages cause a loss greater than one thousand dollars. This is a new, specific offense and is estimated to add 1 offender in prison for a 1.5 year sentence with 2 years on parole, and 2 offenders on probation for 3 years. Passage of this bill could lead to a cumulative DOC impact of 1.5 additional offenders in prison and 7.5 on probation by FY19.

The FY15 average cost of supervision is \$6.04 per offender per day or an annual cost of \$2,205 per offender. The DOC cost of incarceration is \$16.809 per day or an annual cost of \$6,135 per offender.

In summary, DOC assumes a cost of \$6,950 in FY 2017 (1 in prison and 1 on probation), \$19,508 in FY 2018 (1.5 in prison and 4.5 on probation), and \$26,780 in FY 2019 (1.5 in prison and 7.5 on probation).
