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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol** and **Office of the Director** each assume no fiscal impact from the proposal

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal could be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Platte County Sheriff's Office** state currently it is not possible to provide a detailed analysis of the fiscal impact of this bill. It is not possible to predict an officer/deputy involved death. Under this bill as written, if an officer/deputy involved death occurred, the Sheriff's Office would incur overtime costs of approximately \$1,200 per week as long as the mandatory suspension was in effect. Additionally, the suspended deputy would be entitled to back pay and retroactive benefits if cleared of wrongdoing.

Officials from the **Springfield Police Department**, the **Cole County Sheriff's Office**, and the **Boone County Sheriff's Office** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

The nine members of the new Task Force On The Use Of Force By A Law Enforcement Officer are allowed to be reimbursed for expenses but shall not receive a per diem. **Oversight** will reflect a minimal (under \$20,000) amount of expense reimbursement from the General Revenue Fund for this task force.

Oversight will also assume local political subdivisions could implement the provisions in the bill with existing resources.

Officials from St. Louis County, Buchanan County Sheriff's Office, Independence Police Department, St. Charles Police Department, and the St. Louis County Police Department did not respond to our request for fiscal impact.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

The bill establishes a Task Force On The Use Of Force By A Law Enforcement Officer in the Department of Public Safety. The task force must focus its efforts on clarifying the use of force allowed by law enforcement officers in St. Louis County. The task force must consist of nine members appointed by the Department Director that may include, but not be limited to a person from the Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) Commission, and various members of the law enforcement community. The task force shall not meet more than four times annually.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
