FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

Oversight notes this proposal establishes the Task Force on School Safety Improvement. The task force is to be made up of eleven persons, who meet no more than four times a year and are reimbursed for expenses.

Oversight notes, in response to legislation in which a task force has been created, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education has estimated \$261.50 per person for hotels, meals and mileage. Using this figure would result in \$11,506 (\$261.50 x 11 x 4) expenses for the task force.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill establishes a Task Force on School Safety Improvement in the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education consisting of eleven members, appointed by the Commissioner of Education in the department.

The commissioner or his or her designee must convene the first meeting of the task force for the purpose of establishing the bylaws and electing officers. The task force cannot meet more than four times annually and members may be reimbursed for expenses but must not receive a per diem allowance.

The task force is required to conduct studies on school security features and practices schools and law enforcement officers can take to decrease the likelihood that an event or crisis will occur; actions schools and law enforcement officers can take to eliminate or reduce the loss of life and property damage related to an event or crisis; the establishment of programs within schools to provide instruction in grades 7 - 12 on the criminal justice system and make curriculum recommendations for the programs, including recommendations on specific curriculum designed to educate students about career opportunities in law enforcement; and the practicality and need for the appointment of a director of school safety in St. Louis County.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
