#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials at the **Department of Economic Development** assume §620.1910.11(1) extends the sunset date of the program until October 12, 2028. It currently is set to expire October 12, 2016. This is an extension of 12 years.

§620.1910.6 states that the aggregate amount of withholding tax that may be retained by all qualified manufacturing companies shall not exceed \$15,000,000 per year.

Officials at the **Office of Administration's Division of Budget and Planning** assume this legislation would extend the provisions of the Manufacturing Jobs Act from 2016 until 2028. Because this is an extension of an existing program, it will not directly impact Total State Revenue, nor will it impact the calculation under Article X, Section 18(e). Since FY13, the average annual issuance and redemption has been \$5,486,738.

Officials at the **Department of Revenue** assume no fiscal impact from this proposal to their organization.

**Oversight** notes this program is currently scheduled to expire October 12, 2016. This proposal would extend the expiration date to October 12, 2028,

**Oversight** will range the fiscal impact from \$0 (no credits issued) to the annual limit of \$15,000,000.
