#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

# **ASSUMPTION**

**Oversight** was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

**Oversight** notes the Justice Reinvestment Program had an appropriation in FY 2015 (9.010) for \$100,000 in the Department of Corrections to pay counties \$30 per day for housing state prisoners. Oversight could not find a similar appropriation for FY 2016. Oversight assumes decreasing the per diem reimbursement amount from \$30 to \$25 would only have a minimal impact on the Department of Corrections.

## **FISCAL DESCRIPTION**

This bill decreases the amount the division must reimburse a county jail or other institution for the costs of detention from at least \$30 per day per offender to at least \$25 per day per offender. The Department of Corrections is required to enter into an annual contractual agreement with the counties to pay this amount by June 30th of each year.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
