FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol (MHP)** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. MHP issued 483 citations in 2014 for violations of the “Move Over” law. The fine amount varies by county but is typically \$150 or greater.

Officials from the **Department of Transportation, Department of Revenue and Department of Economic Development** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight assumes there could be an increase in citations issued by adding public utility vehicles to the list of vehicles covered under the “Move Over” law, therefore Oversight will reflect a minimal fiscal impact to local political subdivisions to account for the increase in fine revenue.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal adds stationary public utility vehicles displaying lighted amber or amber and white lights to the list of emergency vehicles for which drivers of every motor vehicle must move over or slow down.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
