#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

## **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Revenue** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol (MHP)** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. MHP issued 483 citations in 2014 for violations of the "Move Over" law. The fine amount varies by county but is typically \$150 or greater.

Officials from the **Department of Transportation** and **Department of Economic Development** each assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

### House Amendment 1:

**Oversight** assumes there could be an increase in citations issued by adding any other stationary vehicle to the list of vehicles covered under the "Move Over" law, therefore Oversight will reflect an Unknown fiscal impact to local political subdivisions to account for the increase in fine revenue.

This proposal adds stationary public utility vehicles displaying lighted amber or amber and white lights to the list of emergency vehicles for which drivers of every motor vehicle must move over or slow down.
