#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)** state more than 155,000 UCC filings are filed per year, so additional staff would be needed to conduct the additional review this proposal requires. SOS anticipates two new FTEs would need to be created with salaries at \$29,000 per year. Missouri law requires SOS to file UCC filings within three business days of receipt SOS would have to prioritize this additional review to comply with these guidelines. RSMo § 400.9-519(h).

SOS anticipates a cost of \$80,000 to change the current software operated by the Business Services Division. The estimate for one-time IT costs (\$80,000) is based on previous experiences contracting with vendors to make changes to existing software. The estimate that two additional full-time employees would be needed is based upon the estimate of how many UCC filings would be reviewed per year (150,000).

For the purpose of this proposed legislation, officials at the **Office of State Public Defender** (**SPD**) cannot assume that existing staff will provide competent, effective representation for any new cases arising where indigent persons are charged with the proposed new crime of intentionally filing a fraudulent financing statement or any financing statement with the Secretary of State with the intent to harass or defraud any other person. This offense would be a new Class D Felony.

While the number of new cases (or cases with increased penalties) may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific bill, the SPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide effective representation in all cases where the right to counsel attaches.

**Oversight** assumes the State Public Defender's Office can absorb the additional caseload that may result from this proposal.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services** assume that the creation of a new crime creates additional responsibilities for county prosecutors which may in turn result in additional costs which are difficult to determine.

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office (AGO)** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources. The AGO may seek additional appropriations if the proposal results in a significant increase in cases.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

#### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal specifies that if a person files a document with the recorder of deeds and fails to comply with the standard filing form, the filing will be treated as a provisional filing. If no objection is lodged, the filing is no longer a provisional filing and is treated as any other valid filing. If an objection is made in court, notice of the objection, along with a court date, must be sent to all owners of record, the individual that made the filing, and all parties to the filing.

The proposal creates the offense of filing a false document if he or she files, causes to be filed, or attempts to file, creates, uses as genuine, transfers or has transferred, presents, or prepares with knowledge or belief that it will be filed, presented, or transferred to the secretary of state or his or her designee, any county recorder of deeds or his or her designee, any municipal, county, district, or state government entity or office, or any credit bureau or financial institution specified documents. For the first offense, filing a false document is a class D felony until December 31, 2016, and a class E felony beginning January 1, 2017. Filing false documents is a class C felony in certain specified instances.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
